Reminder: submissions to the Review of culture and accountability in the Queensland public sector

The due date for submissions to the Review of culture and accountability in the Queensland public sector has been extended to Monday, 4 April.

The extension, announced today by the reviewer, Professor Peter Coaldrake AO, follows widespread interest in the matters he has been appointed to consider.

“To date, most submissions have focused on issues relating to individual accountability bodies and the overlaps and underlaps amongst them,” Professor Coaldrake said.

“The Review is particularly interested to receive submissions from members of the community or public sector employees which relate to their own experience of the workings and culture of the public sector.

“Suggestions for streamlining and simplification of processes, from both the consumer and user perspective, are also most welcome,” he said.

“I recognise that such submissions may need more time than we originally allowed and want to encourage strong community participation in this process.”

Professor Coaldrake’s appointment was made by the Premier who announced a “wide-ranging review into culture and accountability in the state’s public sector.”

Professor Coaldrake said that culture and how it influenced government was an important part of his considerations. The interim report is due on 22 April 2022 and the final report in June.
